The Basic Assessment environmental process for the proposed "Kraaibosch Filling and Service Station", Erf 25831, George, refers. This Application has been advertised in the George Herald (issue of 04 November 2010) for a 30-day registration and commenting opportunity, allowing for individuals to register as "Interested and Affected Parties" (I&APs) and / or to raise any preliminary issues or concerns. A Background Information Document has been distributed to direct neighbours, other potential stakeholders as well as local and provincial authorities.

This letter serves to provide feedback on the registration and commenting period. The comments received during the 30-day commenting period have been recorded, and the project team has provided preliminary responses. The attached "Issues & Response Table" contains the comments received, with the preliminary responses. This table is distributed to registered I&APs for information purposes.

**Environmental process way-forward**

The environmental process is still in an early stage and as such, various project team / specialist investigations and studies are currently being undertaken. Several of the issues of concern raised during the aforementioned commenting period are being considered by the project team. The Basic Assessment environmental report will be finalised once the project team has completed their investigations and studies. The Basic Assessment Report will, amongst others, provide more detailed feedback on the issues and concerns raised.

All registered I&APs will be provided with details (through written communication) on the Basic Assessment Report's availability, commenting period as well as where the report can be viewed. It is anticipated that the Draft Basic Assessment Report will be available for review and comment early 2011.
